Michael's Musings

It has often been stated by those of denominationalism that "we are all headed for the same place, just getting there different ways." The idea behind the statement is that all who claim to worship God and follow Jesus Christ are going to Heaven regardless of their religious affiliation or doctrinal beliefs. It has often been stated that one should accept Jesus as savior and then "join the church of your choice." It is not surprising at all to hear such statements from the denominational world but a disturbing trend has manifested itself in preachers and authors within the churches of Christ who are parroting this doctrine of subjectivism. An ever growing trend among some in churches of Christ is to engage in the activities, including worship, of the denominational churches.

It is not our place to judge. Jesus has already given His judgment on these matters and God will ultimately judge all according to their life on this earth. It is only ours to submit to the judgment of God and teach His will concerning these matters. Jesus said "He who rejects Me, and does not receive My words, has that which judges him—the word that I have spoken will judge him in the last day." (**John 12:48 NKJV**). An examination of scripture will provide for the honest seeker of truth the judgment of God on this issue. The judgment of man is of no consequence.

According to **Acts 2:38, 41, and 47** it was obedience to the teaching of baptism for the remission of sins that enabled people on the day of Pentecost to be saved and added to the church of Christ. Jesus had told Peter in **Matthew 16:19** that he would give the disciples the keys to the kingdom of Heaven. This means they would have the truth concerning how one might enter the kingdom. The keys were used that day as Peter preached the gospel in **Acts 2**. Those who responded in obedience were given entrance to the kingdom of Heaven. The act of baptism for the remission of sins is the means by which one is baptized "into Christ" (**Rom. 6:3, 4**). The world of protestant denominationalism has its roots in the teachings of Martin Luther and John Calvin. The Calvinistic teaching of salvation by grace only through faith only (an oxymoron within itself) permeates the entire spectrum of denominationalism. To claim that one may be saved or be a true Christian in obedience to such doctrine is to deny that baptism for the remission of sins is essential to salvation. It also denies the teaching of **Acts 2:38, 41, and 47** that Jesus adds those who have been baptized for the remission of sins to His church.
